History

Candlelighters in the Austin Area was founded in 1988 as a grass-roots, parent-driven nonprofit to aid children and families battling childhood cancer. As the number of families facing the strain of childhood cancer grew (from 15 beneficiary families in the first year to nearly 500 today), Candlelighters evolved into a combined effort between professional social workers and parent/mentor programs to help families cope with the challenges of having a child with cancer. In 2003, Candlelighters merged with Any Baby Can, increasing the scope of both nonprofit organizations.

Vision

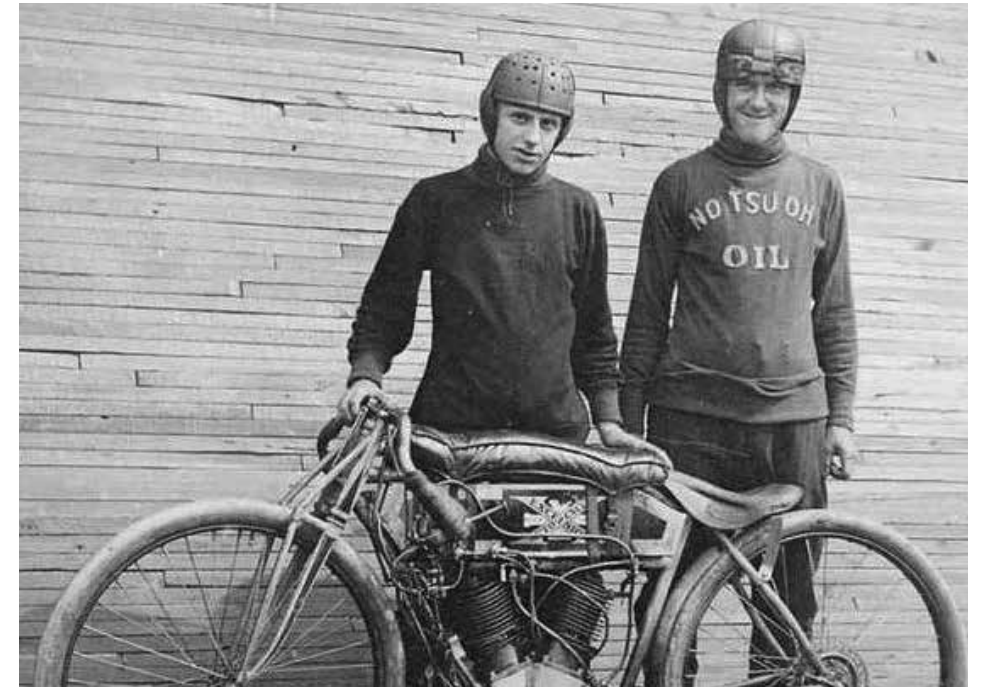
No family should have to go through their journey with cancer alone.

Mission

To provide comprehensive psychosocial support and services for children with cancer and similar blood disorders, and to provide such support to their families as well. Candlelighters provides support throughout all stages of cancer without regard to race, color, national origin, gender, religion, disability, sexual orientation, or financial status. Candlelighters is the only local agency providing a continuum of care to children with cancer and their families, throughout the family's entire struggle with the disease.

Services

Included among the many services offered by Candlelighters are counseling and crisis intervention, support groups, school-based services, family events, holiday celebrations, Camp Grey Dove for siblings, and bereavement services.

Luckenbach

The Harvest Classic is held each October in Luckenbach Texas, a legendary destination for motorcyclists and musicians. The giant oaks, vintage bikes, and world-class cast of characters create a vibe that can't be found anywhere else on earth.

Luckenbach's layout provides a great area for the bike show and sponsor expo area. There's lots of room to walk around and get a good look at all the cool bikes and gear. Of course, the Hill Country provides some of the best roads in Texas, so don't forget to leave some time to explore the area around Luckenbach while you're here!

Bike Show

On Saturday, the Harvest Classic bike show welcomes Vintage and Classic motorcycles and scooters of all origins. We typically have about 200 bikes in the show, and the diversity level is extremely high. Top finishers in each class win coveted one-of-a-kind handmade glass trophies created and donated by one of the Rally's Gold sponsors, Blue Moon Glassworks. We award the trophies Saturday evening.

The judging is by popular vote in the following classes: Pre-1929, 1930-49, 1950-59, 1960-69, 1970-74, 1975-79, 1980-85, Specials, Scooter, Modern, People's Choice

Who Is CTMC?

CTMC is just a fancy name for a small group of people whose lives have been touched by pediatric cancer. Some of us are childhood friends, others are newfound ones, and we all want to do what we can to help kids fight cancer. Many of us work on this rally in honor and memory of Emma Duke, who passed away from Neuroblastoma at the young age of 4.

Emma was the sweet daughter of Russell and Kathy Duke, and throughout Emma's struggle against childhood cancer, the Candlelighters were always there

to provide counseling, special events, Christmas toys, airline tickets for out-of-town treatment, and much more. Even though Emma is in heaven, there are still kids who are fighting cancer right now, and the Candlelighters are there to help them. Our goal at CTMC is to have the Harvest Classic be the best rally you've ever attended and, most importantly, raise as much money as possible for this very worthy charity.
